Top left - The wedding of (Winifred) May Ganner of Wordsley, who married Leonard Oakley of Amblecote, on 9 March 1941. Her stunning wedding dress is now kept in the Museum collection.

Top right - Another dress in our collection belongs to May's sister, Joan, who married Bert Daniel in April 1942. At both weddings, the grooms Leonard and Bert both wore their military uniforms for their ceremonies.

Bottom left- This coat worn worn by bride Muriel Mary Gee (nee Toon), was accepted into the Museum collection in 2024. Muriel married her husband Cliff Gee at Bloxwich Church on February 22 1954.

Bottom right- John Aston and his brother and best man, Alan, standing outside of our 1960s Cast Iron House in 1975. Their mother Daphne's prized roses are in the foreground of this picture. The house was translocated to the Museum in 1996 and now sits close to our 1940s-60s Street.
