Macefield Boys' School in Old Hill was built in 1891 (for 460 pupils) with Mr George Brown as the Headmaster. Harry may have attended this school, or another similar school in the neighbourhood.

Nos 3 & 4 Rooms would be much better for teaching if they were divided by movable glazed partitions. The 3 classes occupying these undivided rooms work at times in unnecessarily difficult conditions. Standard 4 Room accommodating 60 was occupied by 69 boys on 19th June 1906.

20^{th} Nov	Several boys have very bad foot wear. This has caused a falling-off in attendance owing to bad weather on one or two days.
27 th Nov	Stone laying ceremony at Free Library in Cradley Heath.
Dec 1908	Reports of poor attendance by children owing to being badly clad and shod and show signs of being scantily fed. A list of such has been supplied to the attendance officer for enquiry.

Jan 7 th	Headmaster attended a meeting of the Education Committee of the head teachers - re providing foot wear for the children requiring such. A committee was formed to deal with the matter and a collection was made to start the work at once.

29^{th}	Eleven boys have been provided with boots and stockings provided by a fund.
